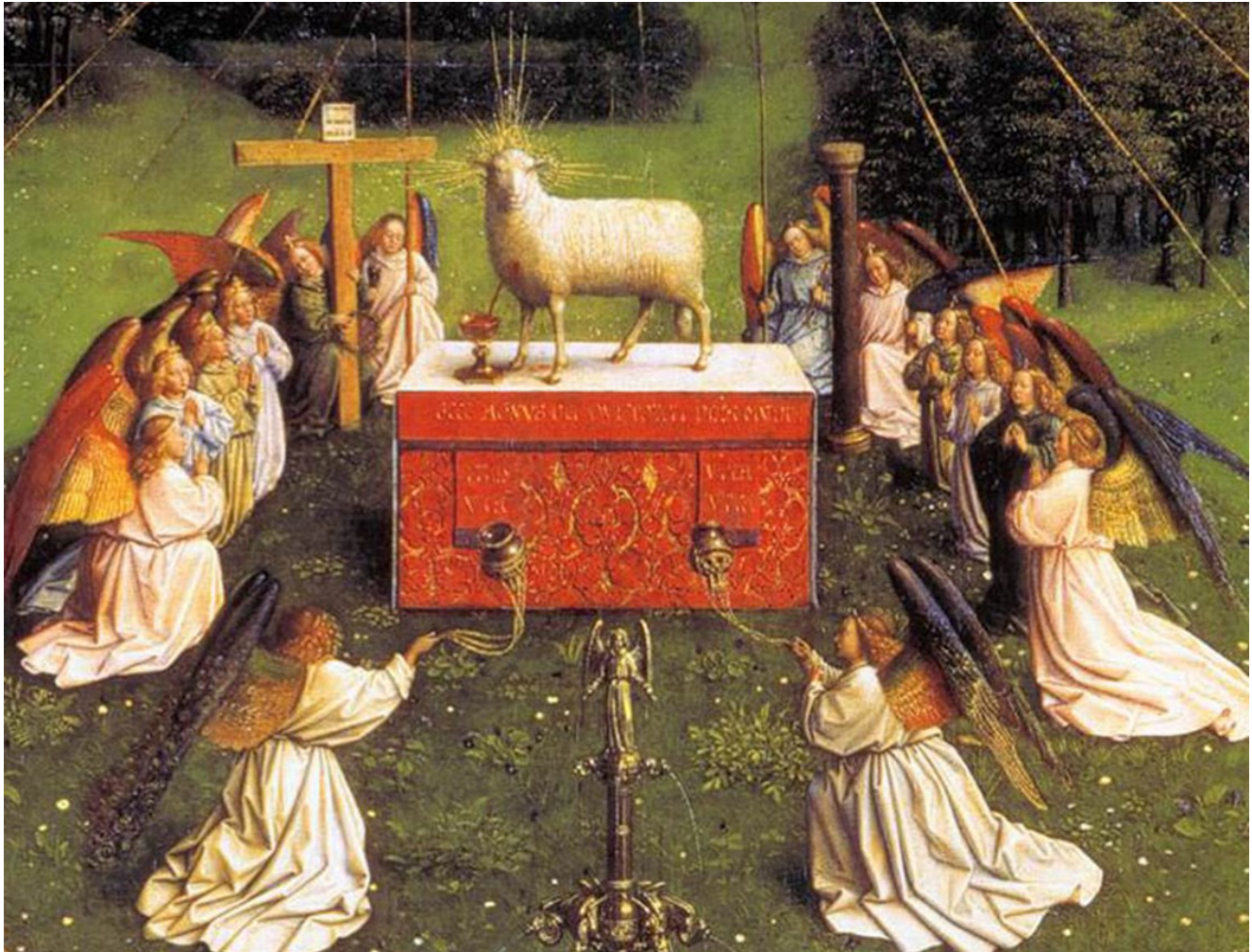

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament

Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in the Monstrance is a beautiful expression of our belief in the Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. We are privileged at St. Augustine to have this devotion every first Tuesday of the month from 7:30 am to 12:00 pm, concluding with Benediction. In 1980, Pope Saint John Paul II wrote, “...the Church and the world have great need of Eucharistic adoration. Jesus waits for us in this sacrament of love. Let us be generous with our time in going to meet Him in adoration and contemplation full of faith. And let us be ready to make reparation for the great faults and crimes of the world. May our adoration never cease.”

To make this possible, we need two adorers for each hour as Jesus in the Monstrance cannot be left alone at any time during exposition. Please sign up for an hour to adore the Lord. The sign-up sheet can be found in the Vestibule of the Church. Venite Adoremus.

The next Adoration will be this Tuesday, April 2, starting at 7:30 a.m. and ends with Benediction at 12:00 noon, in St. Augustine Church.

Marriage Moments

From the ecstasy of Palm Sunday to the crucifixion on Good Friday; it all seems so incompatible and surreal. Is your life ever like this roller coaster? How do you calm each other in the midst of joy and tragedy?

Divine Mercy Sunday

Jesus said to St. Faustina, "I desire that this image be displayed in public on the first Sunday after Easter. That Sunday is the Feast of Mercy. Through the Word Incarnate, I make known the bottomless depth of My mercy."

Please join in the celebration of this Feast Day on April 7, 2024. Immediately at the end of the 11:00 AM Sunday Mass, Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament will occur. At 1:00 pm, the Sacrament of Confession will be made available. At 3:00 PM, the Image will be blessed, and the Divine Mercy Chaplet will be recited. The celebration will conclude with Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament.



One can receive a plenary indulgence fulfilling the conditions:

- Sacramental Confession – either several days before or after the event
- Eucharistic Communion
- Prayer for the intentions of Supreme Pontiff
- The faithful who on Divine Mercy Sunday, in any church or chapel, in a spirit that is completely detached from the affection for a sin, even a venial sin, take part in the prayers and devotions held in honor of Divine Mercy, or who, in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament exposed or reserved in the tabernacle, recite the Our Father and the Creed, adding a devout prayer to the merciful Lord Jesus (e.g. Merciful Jesus, I trust in You!)

Please sign up for a half-hour or hour of Adoration in the book in the Vestibule.

Holy Name of Mary's Children's Liturgy program, aka, Cool (Children of Our Lord) Kids Club is returning to our parish, starting March 3, during the



10:00 am Mass. COOL Kids Club/Children's Liturgy is for children ages 4-8 years old who have not made their First Communion. The priest will call children to come forward before the first reading, he will bless and dismiss them to their class. In

this class they practice prayers, sing and listen to the liturgy of word on their level. They will return to church at the preparation of gifts. This program is highly encouraged. Parents might need to accompany their child the first time or until they are comfortable attending the class. The class will be held in the meeting room/kitchen of the church office building.



Children's Liturgy

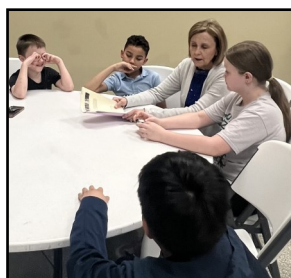

**Come and listen to readings, reflections,
and music as we commemorate the Passion of Jesus Christ
when darkness appeared to be victorious, as each candle is slowly
extinguished throughout the service.
Of course, we know, darkness does not win.**

What is Tenebrae? Tenebrae, or Service of Shadows, was once part of the Church's Divine Office during Holy Week. It was a service of psalms and readings. As the service progressed, the 15 candles on a special candelabrum (a "hearse") would be progressively extinguished, until the last candle was removed from the sanctuary, leaving the church in darkness. The departure of the last candle was accompanied by a strepitus, a "great noise" that alluded to the earthquake when Jesus died, accomplished by the pounding of breviaries, hymnals, or stamping of feet.

Fr. Daniel will do a modified version of the Tenebrae Service at St. Augustine, beginning at 8:00 pm on Good Friday. This is a beautiful opportunity to meditate upon the Word of God and to listen to sacred music as we commemorate the Passion of our Lord.

Holy Week 2024 In Our Clustered Parishes

Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion

On this day at all Masses the Church celebrates Christ's entrance into Jerusalem to accomplish his paschal mystery. Accordingly, the memorial of this event is included in every Mass, with the procession or the solemn entrance. During the Liturgy of the Word, the Church remembers the Lord's Passion with the solemn proclamation from the gospels of His Holy Passion and Death.

Chrism Mass

Tuesday, 7 p.m. of Holy Week, at a Solemn Mass at the Cathedral of the Assumption, the Archbishop consecrates the Holy Oils we use in the sanctifying ministry of the Church. The Oil of Chrism is used for Baptism, Confirmation, Ordination, and the blessing of altars and churches. The Oil of Catechumens blesses and strengthens those preparing to enter the Church through the sacraments of initiation. The Oil of the Sick blesses those who struggle with illness and is a sign of God's healing presence. The priests of the Archdiocese renew their promises to the sacred duties of the priesthood. All are welcome to attend.

Holy Thursday

The Mass of the Lord's Supper is celebrated in the evening with the ***full participation of the whole community and with all clergy exercising their ministry***. The Rice Bowl collection will be taken. We will receive the Holy Oils the Archbishop consecrated at the Chrism Mass. Church will remain open until 10:00 pm.

Holy Saturday

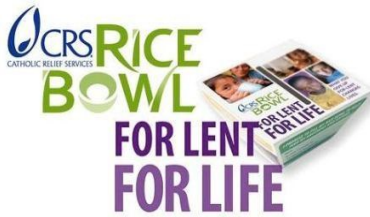
The Church waits at the Lord's tomb, meditating on his suffering and death, and continuing with fasting and prayer. The altar is left bare, and the sacrifice of the Mass is not celebrated. The day begins with RCIA review & practice at St. Augustine Church. Only after the solemn vigil during the night does the Easter celebration begin, with a spirit of joy that overflows into the following period of fifty days.

Easter

The 8:30 p.m. Easter Vigil Mass on Saturday will be celebrated at St. Augustine and Holy Name of Mary.

Beginning after sunset, the Church will fully initiate those who have been preparing for the sacraments. The Mass continues with the Liturgy of the Word where we remember the saving acts of God on our behalf. At the Liturgy of Baptism we initiate fully those who have been preparing for the sacraments all year, celebrating also the sacrament of Confirmation. The liturgy reaches its summit with the Eucharist to commemorate the death and resurrection of the Lord.
